What do you need to know before this topic?

Understand the UK is split into different countries.
 Know where the UK is on a map of the world.
 Know that the UK is on the European continent.
 Understand the physical and human features of the UK.
 Know some of the symbols found on an OS map.
 Know the difference between urban and rural settlements.
 Know what is the UK's climate like.

Key Assessment Questions:

What are the similarities and differences between particular countries located in Europe?
 Can you locate on a map the countries of Italy, Russia and Great Britain?
 What is human geography?
 What is physical geography?
 What is the difference between a country and a continent?
 What are the points on a compass?

Sticky Knowledge:

There are seven continents of the World: Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Australia, Europe, North America and South America.
 Key cities of Europe include London, Rome, Paris and Moscow.
 Physical Geography is natural.
 Human geography is man-made.
 The Equator is an invisible line around the middle of the Earth.
 The Tropic of Cancer is north of the Equator. The Tropic of Capricorn is south of the Equator.
 Lines of longitude run from north to south. Lines of latitude run east to west.
 The 8 points on a compass which are North, North East, East, South East, South, South West, West and North West

Key Vocabulary:

continents, countries, city, globe, northern hemisphere, southern hemisphere, Tropic of Capricorn, Tropic of Cancer, Equator, human geography, physical geography, OS map, symbol, grid references, four-figure grid references.

Key Skills:

On a world map, locate the seven continents of the world and the five oceans.
 To name key physical geographical features found across Europe including rivers and mountain ranges.
 To name key human geographical features found across Europe including key buildings/landmarks.
 Compare cities across Europe based on their human and physical features.
 Use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.
 Locate and name the Equator and Tropic of Cancer/Capricorn.
 Identify symbols on an OS map and give their four figure grid reference.
